Greetings, Fellow Legionnaires:

I would like to thank each of you for bearing with me during my first eight months as your Department

Adjutant. Denise has been with us for about four months and is doing a great job of learning all her various responsibilities. It is great to have her as a part of the American Legion family. While Membership has remained current throughout this year, some of my tasks as Adjutant had fallen behind. I am able to report that the Department office is current in all aspects of its operation.

Membership for the 2017 - 2018 year: Our National Target Dates thus far had been to be at 50% of our annual goal by 9/13/2017; at 55% by 10/12/2017; at 65% by 11/15/2017; at 74.37% by 12/15/17; and 80.46% at 1/18/18. To this end, the Department of Louisiana has met and exceeded each of these National goals. As of 1/18/18, Louisiana ranks 48th of 55 internationally. As a Department, our Membership rate is slipping and we need all the help we can get!! At 12/31/17, the Department was over 4% behind 12/31/16.

Legionnaire and News & Views: The next issue of each will be published in May 2018. For the Legionnaire, I ask each District Commander and Post Commander to submit an article or pictures to show what has been going on in each of your communities. These articles and pictures need to be submitted on or before April 1, 2018.

We need to replenish the NFF: National Emergency Fund, especially after the effects of Hurricane Harvey have impacted our State. While our minimum goal of \$.50 per member has been met, collecting over \$19,000, we still have only 26 Posts out of 206 Posts State-wide that have contributed to this fund: that is 180 Posts within Louisiana who have not yet contributed. Please contribute to this fund at least \$.50 per member!!!

Funds received from Poppy drives are used for our Children and Youth Programs, Direct or Temporary Financial Assistance. We are getting an increased number of such requests, but to date only 13 Posts have contributed to this fund leaving 193 Posts that have not contributed to this fund; that is 93.7% of our 206 Posts State-wide that have not contributed!!! Please. if your Post has not contributed, write out a check today of at least \$25.00 if your Post has under 200 members and \$40.00 if your Post has over 200 members. Or better yet, do a Poppy drive; keep 50% of the proceeds in your Post and send the other 50% to the Poppy FundIII

The Commission on Media/Communications will meet on Saturday, <u>May 12th, 2018</u> in Department Headquarters at 9:00 AM. Categories for the Awards are as follows:

CATEGORY 1 – POST PUBLICATION AWARD: A Post Publication is a newsletter mailed to each member at least six (6) times during the period July to May. The information part of this newsletter may be printed: Electronically and emailed to members or by any other type of printing process and mailed out. Each entry will be judged on format, general appearance, legibility, news content, reader's interest and community service.

CATEGORY 2- DISTRICT PUBLICATION

AWARD: A District Publication is a newsletter mailed to each post in the District at least six (6) times during the period July 1 to April 30. The rules and judging are the same as for Post Publication.

<u>CATEGORY 3 – POST PUBLICITY</u> <u>CHAIRMAN AWARD</u>:

The name of each Post Publicity Chairman must be submitted by their respective Post Commander and received by their District Media/Communications Chairperson no later than 3:00 PM, May 11, 2018. Candidates will be judged on the information submitted to the Media/Communications Commission. Information considered, but not strictly limited to: Newspaper articles, On-Line articles (published or un-Activity published), Post Announcements with or without photos. Attach a letter of recommendation and supporting documents describing the candidate's activities.

<u>CATEGORY 4 – AWARD FOR THE</u> <u>OUTSTANDING POST SCRAPBOOK</u>:

A Post Scrapbook tells the story of the Post during the current Legion year. There must be a caption under each picture describing the activity depicted and names should be listed if practical. The American Legion emblem must be affixed on the cover of the Scrapbook. Each book will be judged on neatness, contents, activities and interest.

POST NARRATIVE: The Narrative History Book should be a one-year Post chronicle. This is the most important chapter in your history and must be as complete as possible with a graphic account of the Post and its activities. The Historian should relate in narrative form and chronological order all important events and programs conducted during the year by the Post or conducted jointly with the Auxiliary Unit, the Sons Squadron, the Parish, the District, the Department and National levels. (Remember, this is the Post's History and not the Department or National). **THIS FORM MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH SCRAPBOOK OR NARRATIVE FOR JUDGING.**

CATEGORY 5 – **LOCAL NEWSPAPER AWARD**: The Commission will recognize local newspapers that provide a broad treatment of American Legion Programs and activities. It is the responsibility of each Post to supply information to local newspapers. Awards will be presented in the following categories: All local newspaper coverage, one to multiple local papers, can be combined into one single submittal. All articles must pertain to the activities of the Post, Post events, programs and other involvements in the Post community.

CATEGORY 6 – MULTI/MEDIA AWARD: The Commission will recognize two Divisions of Electronic Media Venues used by Posts to further the mission, message and programs of the American Legion. One award in each Division will recognize the Post that best represents each Division as follows: **Division 1** --- Web Page, Facebook Page, Twitter Pages, etc. **Division 1** will be judged on the Professional Design of the page, that being, the use of the American Legion LOGO, Post number and location, and the attractiveness to the general public to create interest and the desire to join the American Legion. It will also be judged on the updates of activities of the Post as well as the activities and updates of the Department. Each page should also include reasons and benefits of becoming an American Legion member as part of their general design. For submittal, all access Links should be sent to

<u>genefranques@gmail.com</u> no later than May 1, 2017. **Division 2** --- Radio, TV, Editorials, Public Announcements, etc. **Division 2** applies to Post achievements in Radio/TV editorials, live coverage, live interviews and announcements.
